 appoint my said loving wife to be whole and sole Executrix of this my last will and
 Testament hereby revoking all wills by me formerly made witness my hand and Seal -
 this twenty fifth day of May anno Dom: 1726. it is my will and Desire before the signing
 of this will that if it should please God that my Son John Should die before he comes to be of
 age or be lawfully married that all my Land and real Estates shall be enjoyed by my said
 loving wife During the time of her naturall life and after her Death shall descend to
 John the son of Joseph Royal to be his and his heirs for ever.

 bargain and confirm unto the said Robert Hudson Jun^r. Two hundred acres of Land more
 less lying at Beaver ponds upon Swift Creek in the County of Hennico; being the one half of a tract of
