This Indenture made the twenty fifth Day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and twenty eight Between John Sutton Farrar of the one part and Thomas Handolph Gent^r of the other part witnesseth that the said John Sutton Farrar for and in Consideration of five hundred pounds Currant money to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath given Granted Bargained Sold Aliened Enfeoffed and Confirmed and by these presents Doth give Grant Bargain Sell Alien Enfeoff and Confirm unto the said Thomas Handolph his Heirs and Assignes for ever a Certain Tract or parcell of Land situate lying and being in the parish and County of Henrico and commonly known by the name of Henrico Containing by Estimation four hundred and thirty two Acres of Land be the same more or less which Land is bounded by James River the Land of John Bolling Jun^r the Land late in the possession of Thomas Farrar and by him conveyed unto Thomas Handolph the Land of Robert Bullington the Land of Thomas and Henry Jordan, and the Land of Martha Cox which said Land is part of a Certain Tract of land granted by patent unto William Farrar Grandfather of the said John Sutton Farrar dated the Eleventh day of June in the year 1637, and all houses edifices orchards gardens trees woods underwoods ways waters water Courses swamps profits advantages Commodities Emoluments and hereditaments whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and also the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders Rents profits and issues thereof and every part and parcel thereof and all the Estate right title interest Claim and Demand whatsoever of him the said John Sutton Farrar of in or to the premises or any part or parcel thereof with the appurtenances To have and to hold the said Tract or parcell of Land with the
