 sick and weak but sound and perfect memory and understanding blessed god for the same I do make and declare
 this present Writing to be and contain my last will and Testament in manner and form following first and principally
 I do commend my soul into the hands of my most blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ hoping by and thro' his merits
 of this Death and Passion I shall receive full and free pardon of my sins and obtain eternal life with him in his heavenly Maner
 of angels My Body I commit to the earth to be decently buried by and at the Discretion of my Executors herein after named
 and as to that worldly estate as it hath pleased Almighty god to bless me with I give and bequeath in
 manner following In full I give and bequeath unto my Loving Son John Martin and in his favour the plantation Ly on the
 West side James River that my father gave us and also a boy named George half a Dozen of New pasture land two Dishes
 and one Duffe a young horse and one Cow and half an Aker and one Rug and one blanket and one pair of shoes
 and one Dow with piggs. I also give and bequeath unto my two Sons William Martin Mathew Martin the plantation
 above now said to be equally Divided between my son William and my son Mathew after my beloved Wifes Death
 and my son William Martin to have the lower part of the said land joining Mathew Hopson and the W. W.

I suppose and my son Mathew Martin to have the upper part of the said land and I give unto my son William Martin one negro
 girl named Hannah the said and her weep and one cow and calf and one sow and piggs and one wear Colt one pair Dick
 and one Bason and three plates to him and his heirs forever. You I give and bequeath to my son Mathew Martin the first three
 Child living that fillis or Hannah. One bring and if they Don't bring us living Child my beloved Wife Mary Martin shall
 pay him Twenty pounds for out Money and one young man Colt and one cow and calf and one sow and piggs and one pair Dick
 and one Bason and three plates. And my son John Martin shall build along fence and Twenty foot long and sixteen foot wide with
 one outside Chimney painted and covered with Shingles for my son Mathew Martin and my son William Martin shall help my
 son Mathew Martin to build one Tobacco house two and twenty foot long and Twenty in wide. You all the rest and residue of my
 estate after my just Debts and Legacies are fully paid and satisfied give Devise and Bequeath unto my loving Wife for and
 during the term of her Natural life and after her Decease to be equally Divided amongst my three sons John William Mat
 thew. I forgive and their heirs forever and I do hereby Make, Nominate, Constitute and appoint my Loving Wife, Peter Martin
 and William Scot executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Will, by me formerly Made
 publishing Declaring this present writing to be my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my

This Indenture made this twenty sixth Day of february anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and
 thirty five betwixt Benjamin Mofby of the County of Guilford and the one part and Thomas Botbol son of the County
 of Henrico the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Mofby for and in consideration of the sum of fourteen pounds law
 money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the aforesaid Thomas Botbol the receipt whereof the said Benjamin Mofby doth
 acknowledge and know from both accounts and Discharge the said Thomas Botbol his heirs and Assigns by these presents hath
 given granted bargain and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the aforesaid Thomas and for Peter
 Smith Daughter of the aforesaid Thomas Botbol and her heirs forever three hundred Acres of land be the same more
 or less lying on the North side of the White Oak Swamp adjoining on the branches of the aforesaid Swamp it being the upper
 part of that six hundred and thirty five Acres of land
