this present Writing to be and contain my last will and Testament in manner and form following first and principally

of his Death and passion I shall receive full and free pardon of my sins and obtain eternal life with him in his heavenly Maner
of angels My Body I commit to the earth to be decently buried by and at the Discretion of my executor herein after named
and as to what worldly estate as it hath pleased Almighty god to bless me with I give and bequeast in
manner following I give and bequeast unto my loving son John Martin and his heirs forever the plantation Lyon the
last six James River that my father gave us and also a boy named Roger half a Dozen of new packer plates two Dishes
and one Dagon a young horse and one cow and calf and also one Ring and one blanket and a pair of shoes
and one bow with piggs. I now give and bequeast unto my two sons William Martin Mathew Martin the plantation
where now live to be equally divided between my son William and my son Mathew after my beloved Wifes Death
and my son William Martin to have the lower part of the said land joining Mathew Hopson and the W. W.

 money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the aforesaid Thomas Botchell the receipt whereof the said Benjamin Mofby doth
 acknowledge and that from both the aforesaid and discharge the said Thomas Botchell his heirs and assigns by these presents hath
 given granted bargain and sell and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the aforesaid Thomas and Elizabeth
 Smith Daughters of the aforesaid Thomas Botchell and to their heirs forever three hundred acres of land both the same more
 or less lying on the North Side of the White Oak Swamp adjoining on the branches of the aforesaid Swamp adjoining the upper
 part of that six hundred and thirty five Acres of land
