branch to John Dod's line being the half of two hundred and
Seventy Acres to him and the heirs of his body for Ever. Also the Re-
mainder part of my land I give to my Wife During her Natural
life and afterwards to my Daughter Elizabeth to her and to
the heirs of her body Ever also I give to my Daughter Elizabeth
one Iron Pot one feather bed and bolster one sheet one blanket and
one Pewter Dish Also I give to Daughter Anne Williams one Iron Pot
one feather bed and bolster one blanket one sheet and one Pewter
Dish Also I give to my Daughter Francis Williams one feather
bed and bolster one blanket one sheet one Iron Pot and one Pewter
Dish Also to my Son Richard Williams one Shilling Sterling Also
to my Daughter Mary one Shilling Sterling Lastly all the Rest
of my Estate of What Nature or kind Soever I give and bequeath
to my loving Wife Elizabeth Williams Whome I appoint my
Whole and Sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament

Also I desire that my Estate may not be appraised by Witneses
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my
Seal this 10 Day of May 1747. Signed Sealed and Acknow-
