Inp^mis I commit my Soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it hoping thereby to receive forgiveness for all my Sins I also commit body to the Earth to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter Mentioned and as to my Worldly Goods I Dispose of y^m as

I'lloweth Item I give and bequeath to my Son Edward Worsham my
Land in Amelia County called barebone containing 345 Acres be it more
or less. to him and his heirs forever. Likewise give to my said Son Edward
Worsham one Negro man called Canida and to his heirs forever. Item
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Worsham one Negro man
named Dick and also a Negro Girl named Rachel and to her heirs for
ever. Item I give to my Son John Worsham one Negro man called Jack
& to his heirs forever. I Likewise give to my said Son John Worsham my
two Lots in Bermuda Hundred Town whereon my kitchen and milk
house now stands I farther give my Long Gun Sword and pistalls to
my said Son John Worsham & to his heirs for ever. Item I give my Negro
woman Sarah and her Increase to be Equally Divided between my three
Children Mary, John, & Edward Worsham when my Son John shall arrive
to the age of Twenty one Years but If either of these my three Children
Should dye in their non age then the said Legacy to be Equally Divided
between the two Survivors to them and their heirs for ever. Item I give to
my Brother Joshua Worsham all my wearing Cloaths my Will is my
Estate be not Appraised. also my will is ^{that} my two Sons be bound to a trade
my Will is that the Rest of my Estate not yet given away may be sold
for ready money except my Stock, and the Estate so Sold to be Equally
Divided between my three Children Mary, John, & Edward Worsham in
Money or Negroes, as my Executors shall think fit and also the stock in
like manner as they shall arrive to age to them & their heirs for ever.
Lastly I appoint Cap^t. Thomas Branch & Cap^t. Edward Osborne Executors
of this my last will & Testament In Witness hereof I have hereunto

 to him in hand Paid by the said Ware Rockett the Receipt whereof he Doth hereby
 acknowledge hath granted Bargained Sold Alien'd Released and Confirmed
 and by these presents for himselfe & his heirs Doth grant Bargain sell Alien
 Release and Confirme unto the said Ware Rockett and to his heirs and assigns
 forever one certain tract or parcel of Land containing Eighty five Acres more
 or less within the Bounds hereafter mentioned & Situate lying and being
 in the parish of Dale and County aforesaid and on the South Side of falling
 Creek being the tract of Land given him in a Deed of Gift by his Father John
 Burton begining at a beach a corner of James Burtons in fall Creek Thence
 up a Branch south east to a line of Coll. W^m Birds and Corners upon a poplar
 thence running South West to a corner Pine and White Oak to a rather branch
 thence down the S^d Branch North East to falling Creek and so Down the S^d
 Creek where first begun at Together with all houses Orchards gardens fences
 Woods Underwoods waters and Water Courses thereon Standing growing and
 being with all Profits Commodities Advantages and Appurtenances whatsoever
 to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and also the Reversion
 and the Reversions Remainder and Remainders thereof and of Every Part &
