In the name of God Amen I Joseph Royall of Dale Parish in
the County of Henrico being of Perfect sound memory & understanding
Calling to mind the uncertainty of this Life do make & ordain this my
last Will & Testament in manner & form following (that is to say) first &
principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping
to receive full Pardon & remission of all my Sins & to inherit the Kingdom
of Heaven & everlasting Life through the Merits of my Blessed Lord &
redemer Jesus Christ. my body I commit to the Earth to be decently Buried
at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as touching what
worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give & bequeath
as follows. Imprimis I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Farre Six
Silver Spoons of the Value of four pounds Sterling & she having already had
her Part of my Negroes goods & chattles. Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter
Elizabeth Archer Six Silver Spoons of the Value of four pounds Sterling & my
Silver Passenger also one Negro Man named Lewis she having already
had her Part of my Negroes goods & chattles

Item I give & bequeath to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Royall Daug-
ter to my son William Royall Doz: one Negro boy named Roger to be
delivered to her when ^{she} shall arrive to the age of Twenty one years or
Marries but if she dies before that time ~~then~~ there I give & be-
queath the said Negro boy to my Grandson Joseph Royall Son of Richard
Royall Item I give & bequeath to my son John Royall one Feather bed &
furniture one Dozⁿ Pewter Plates Six Dishes & Six Silver Spoons of the
Value of Four Pounds Sterling also Five Negroes Viz^t Sampson, Tom
Lucy Jenny & old Tom to him & his Heirs for ever Item I give & bequeath
to my Grandson Joseph Royall Son of Littlebury Royall one Negro boy
named Billy & one Feather bed & furniture Item I give & bequeath to my
Grandson Joseph Royall Son of Richard Royall my Silver Tankard
Item I give & bequeath to my son Littlebury Royall Two Hundred Acres of
Land lying on Appomattox River joining to a parcel or Tract I gave him
by Deed of gift Containing Two Hundred Acres of Land also to him &
his Heirs or assigns for ever. I give my son Littlebury Two Featherbeds
& furniture one Dozⁿ Pewter Plates Six Dishes Six Silver Spoons of the
Value of Four Pounds Sterling my Bell mettle skillet & Four Negroes Viz^t
Abraham, Ben, Aggy & Skipper with all the Increase of the said Aggey from this
time to him & his Heirs for ever I also give him the use of half my tended
ground & fencing to work two hands upon for the Space of Seven Years
after my death with the liberty to keep three Cows & Calves on the Plantation
also the use of all my houses except one Tobacco House or the Housess my son
Richard has in his Possession if he chooses to live in the House from

live in. I give my son Littlebury half my Part of Martin Hounds to him & his Heirs. Item I give & bequeath to my Son Richard Royall all my land in Bermuda hundred also all the Land I have at Hinton to him & his Heirs forever. Provided that if the Land I gave my son William Royall Dec'd lying on Appomattox River should become his by the death of my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Royall Daughter to my son William he then makes my son Littlebury Royall a good Right in fee Simple in & to the said Land with all its appertinences. I also give my son Richard Royall Two Negroes Viz' Will & Jack to him and his Heirs forever.

Item, My Will & desire is there be no appraisement or Inventory of my Estate.

Item I give & bequeath all the rest of my Estate to be Equally divided between my three Sons Richard John & Littlebury Royall who I ordain constitute and appoint my Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Twenty Sixth Day of February in the year of our Lord Christ One Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty Seven.
