Phillimon Childers acknowledged this Deed with Livery and Seizin endorsed from himself to Tho. Bethell
him to be his Out and Deed then Elizabeth Wife to the said Phillimon being first privately examined
relinquished her Right of Dower to the Land thereby conveyed All which was admitted to Record.

In the Name of God Amen I Magdalen Chastain of King William Parish in Henrico County
in Virginia being at this present time sick and weak of Body but blessed be God in perfect and sound Memory
and knowing the Danger and uncertainty of this mortal Life have made this my present Will and
Testament in the following manner.

First I resign my Soul to God Almighty from whence it came in hopes of a forgiveness of all my Sins
and a joyfull resurrection and Secondly my Body to be decently buried after my Decease and my Executor
shall think fit.

Item I leave and bequeath unto my well beloved Son Anthony Trabu my Negro Woman Betty
and her Child Jenny for him and his Heirs for ever my Riding Horse called Spark with a new Saddle
and Bridle belonging to it One of my Gold rings marked MC the large Psalm Book a Silver Seal and 10
Barrels of Corn and my Desire is that he may be free by Vertue of this my present Will and Testament.

Item to my well beloved Daughter Magdalen Trabu I leave and bequeath my Cupboard my Side Table
One Hog from my black Silk Suit of Cloath and my Collar which is not as yet made up One Gold ring
with red stones One pair Gold Hobbs and my small Psalm Book my Silver Girt Buckle One Silver
Bookkin and Thimble with my Spectacles.

Item to my well beloved Daughter Judith Trabu I leave and bequeath my Chest my red Silk Suit
of Cloath and my striped Suit lined with red Silk a Suit from One Gold ring marked MT One pair
Gold Hobbs with small red stones One pair Silver Buckles and One Bookkin.

Item to my well beloved Son John James I leave and bequeath One Chain Gold Ring and a
Silver Tea Spoon.

Item I will leave and bequeath the remainder part of my Cloath to be equally divided between my
Two mentioned Daughters.

Item I will and desire that my Daughter Magdalen be boarded at my Son Jacob Trabu her
Brother or at here God will or Eliza. Sutton which her self shall like best. And I will and desire

that my Daughter Judith be placed or boarded with her Brother Jacob he being willing to it if not with her Aunt Mary Flournoy.

Item I will and desire that my son John James be placed or boarded with his Brother Jacob if willing to take him if not to his God mother Susanna Farley.

Item I will and bequeath the remainder part of my particular estate after Debts and other demands are paid and satisfied to my son Jacob Trabu.

Item I will ordain and constitute my well beloved Brother Francis Flournoy to be Executor and Adm. of this my present last Will and Testament and I renounce to all Laws and Customs that shall or may be contrary to this my last Will and Testament. **In Witness** thereof I have herewith set my hand and seal this second Day of June 1720.

Know all men by these presents that I John Smith of Georgia County do for several good
causes me therein more meeting but more especially for the consideration of Ten Pound current Money
to me in hand paid by John Roper Jun. of Charles City ^{County} the Receipt of which I do acknowledge myself
to be fully satisfied content and paid and do hereby and thereof fully acquit and discharge the said John
Roper Jun. his heirs Executors or Administrators And doth by these presents bargain sell convey
transfer and make over and hath by these presents bargained sold alienated transferred and made over
unto the said John Roper Jun. his heirs Executors or Assigns One parcel or Tract of Land
lying and being in the County and Parish of Sevier on the South side of Chittahomby Swamp it being
part of One Hundred Acres of Land that was purchased by Humphrey Smith of M. John Pleasants and
the said Humphrey Smith gave it to his two sons John Smith and Philipon Smith and was devised by a
Line of marked Trees each son to have fifty Acres more or less as the same is divided, together with
all the trees thereon with all sowed Orchard Gardens
