

In the Name of God Amen, In the year of our Lord 1736: I Marshall Wilkinson of the County of Henrico do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say, particularly first of all I give my soul unto god that gave it and my Body unto the earth and as for my worldly goods as followeth Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Wilkinson four silver Spoons three plates one white rugg one New Blankette one Cow and calf one Drigg Drigpan and Spile and my bed and bolster one Iron pott on pewter Dish one pair of harrisons one basin Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Jary Wilkinson one small Iron pott one dish and three plates one Drigg Drigpan and Spile one New Basin one hamock one pillow one bow. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Burn one bow and calf. Item I give and bequeath to my son Geore Cardwell one hellsor. Item I give to my daughter Martha Wilkinson one pair of hand Irons one great pot one Dish and three plates one basin and my part of Negropeller furthermore it is my Will that my son shall be for himself at eighteen years of age furthermore it is my Will and desire that my daughter Martha shall have the remainder of my Estate and I do constitute and Ordain my Daughter Martha my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have set my hand and seal the 21st day of September 1736.

This Indenture made and concluded this fifth day of April anno Domini 1736 Between John Lewis of Goodland County Son of William Lewis Deceased of the one part and Joseph Woodson Son of John Woodson of the County and parish of Henrico of the Other part, Witnesseth That the said John Lewis for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling money to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Woodson The receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and himself therewith fully satisfied contented and paid hath granted bargained and sold and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the aforesaid Joseph Woodson one Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County and parish of Henrico near the Western Run of Turkey Island Creek near unto the Land of William Porter Jr containing one hundred Acres or thereabouts be the same more or less it being all that Tract of Land which William Lewis father of the aforesaid John Lewis bought of William Porter as by Deed on the Records of Henrico may appear To have and To hold the aforesaid one hundred acres of Land be the same more or less belonging unto the aforesaid Joseph Woodson and his heirs and assigns forever And the said John Lewis administratres and assigns that he will forever hereafter warrant and defend the aforesaid Land and premises from himself and his heirs unto the said Joseph Woodson and his heirs and assigns forever as an absolute Estate in fee simple In Witness whereof he the said John Lewis hath hereunto set his hand and seal dated above.
