 I give my Soul unto god that gave it and my Body unto the Earth and as for my W^t & L^y goods as
 followeth Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Wilkinson for his love Spunes three plates
 one White rugg one New Blanket one Cow and Calf one Dipping pan and Spile and my bed
 and bolster one Iron pott on pewter Dish one pair of han Irons one Basin Item I give and bequeath
 to my daughter Lucy Wilkinson one small Iron pott one dish and three plates one Dipping pan and Spile
 one New Basin one hamock one pillar one bow Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Barn
 one bow and Calf Item I give and bequeath to my son George Cardwell one halfer Item I give
 to my daughter Martha Wilkinson one pair of han Irons one great pott one Dish and three plates
 one Basin and my part of Negropette furthermore it is my Will that my son shall be for himself at
 eighteen years of age furthermore it is my Will and desire that my daughter Martha shall have the
 remainder of my Estate and I do constitute and Ordain my Daughter Martha my Whole and sole
 Executor of this my Last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this

21 day of September 1736.

This INDENTURE made and concluded this fifth day of April anno Dom^o 1736 Between John Lewis of Goochland County Son of William Lewis Deceased of the one part and Joseph Woodson Son of John Woodson of the County and parish of Henrico of the other party Witneseth That the said John Lewis for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling Money to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Woodson the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and himself therewith fully satisfied Contented and paid hath granted bargained and sold and doth by these presents grant Bargain and sell unto the aforesaid Joseph Woodson one tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County and parish of Henrico near the Western Run of Turkey Island Creek neare unto the Land of William Porter Jr Containing one hundred Acres or thereabouts be the same more or less it being all that Tract of Land which William Lewis Grandfather of the aforesaid John Lewis bought of William Porter esy Deed on the Records of Henrico may appear To have And To hold the aforesaid one hundred Acres of Land be the same more or less Together with all houses Woods and Water and all Improvements and appurtenances thereunto or there upon belonging unto the aforesaid Joseph Woodson and his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Lewis for himself his heirs &c doth further grant and agree to and with the said Joseph Woodson his heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns that he will forever hereafter warrant and defend the aforesaid Land and premises from himself and his heirs and to the said Joseph Woodson and his heirs and assigns forever as an absolute Estate in fee simple In witness whereof he the said John Lewis hath hereunto set to his hand and seal dated above /
