

In the name of god amen I Richard Coe Son of the parish and County of Henrico being sick and weak but in perfect sense an memory I thank almighty god for it I do make this my last Will in manner following In presence I give and bequeath to my Son John Coe and to his heirs and assigns forever all my outward Land it being one hundred and five Acres where he now liveth. Item I give devise and bequeath to my Son Henry Coe all my Land it being one hundred and five Acres of Cornfields Creek containing one hundred Acres to the said Henry Coe on his heirs forever. Item I give to my loving Wife mary Coe one hundred Acres of the same howe where the House is standing and bequeath to my Daughter Mary four and to her heirs one Belle-mettle Shelllet & small Iron pott. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hitchens one pig Cow and all her increase to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my grandson Richensn Coe one hundred and five Acres of Land where my Son Richard Coe now liveth binding upon Will. Turpin and Mich<sup>l</sup>. Turpin lines to him the said Richensn and his heirs forever. Item I give bequeath to my Son Richard Coe one Shilling Sterling. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca for her one Shilling. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Beth Walter my Books and Spectles. Item I give and bequeath to my loving Wife mary Coe all my Hogs and Sheeps and my mare Bedle and saddle and all rest of my Estate and lastly constituted and appointed my loving Wife Mary Coe my Whelan sole Executrix of this my last Will and of the same disannulling and making void all other Wills heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of July 1734. I also give to my said Wife Mary my Negro man Duml during his Life and thereafter to my Son John Coe
