This Letter of Attorney from Joseph Tichell to Charles Thomas was proved by John Wayles a Witness thereto and was ordered to be recorded.

In the Name of God Amen I Mary Harris of the County of Henrico being Sick and Weak in body but of sound and perfect sense and Memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth Viz first I give and bequeath my Soul to the almighty god who gave it hoping through the merits of my Deare Saviour Jesus Christ to Receive full and free pardon for all my sins and my Body to the Earth from whence it came to be buried at the Discretion of my Executricks hereafter Named as to my Worldly Estate what it hath pleased the almighty god to be stow upon me After my Debts and funarall Charges are paid I give as followeth Viz I am I give and bequeath to my son John Harris one Negrow man Named Dick to him and his Heirs forever I am I give and bequeath to my son James Harris my Right and Title to a peice of Land Called Whidbe and one Negrow man Named Bristol I also give him my yoke of Oxen and a large Looking Glasse and one feather Bed and furniture belonging to it to him and his heirs forever I am I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin Harris one Negrow Wench Named Phillis to him and his heirs forever I am I give and bequeath to my son William Harris one negrow Gail Named Anneke to him and his Heirs forever I am I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary James one feather Bed and furniture belonging to it and fifteen pound Currant money of Virginia to her and her heirs forever I am I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Harris one Negrow boy Named Jabilers and one feather Bed and furniture

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belonging to it my Riding Horse to her and her heirs forever. I am I give
and bequeath to my Daughter Edith Osborne one feather Bed and furniture
belonging to it and fifteen pound current money of Virginia to her and her
heirs forever. I am I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Pastore
Twenty Pound current money of Virginia to her and her heirs forever.
I am I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Harris one Negro Wench
Named Jegg and her Child Named Jude and I also give her one feather
Bed and furniture belonging to it and my young horse to her & her heirs
forever. I am I give and bequeath to my Gran Daughter Elizabeth Harris
my Riding Sadel and Bridel to her and her heirs forever. I am I give
and bequeath all the Rest of my Estate to be Equally Divided amongst my four
Sons without any appraisement and I make my four Sons my sole and
Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof
I have here unto put my hand and Seal this 2th of October Anno: 1744

At a Court held for Henrico County the first Monday in September 1745
this last Will and Testament of Mary Harris Dec^d was Presented by John Harris,
Benjamin Harris, and William Harris, three of the Executors thereto, upon Oath
which was also proved by the Witnesses thereto, and Ordered to be Recorded.

hereby acknowledge hath granted Bargained sold Alienated released and
Confirmed and by these presents for himselfe and his heirs doth grant
Bargain sell alien releas and confirm unto the said William Newby
his heirs and assigns for ever one certain Tract or parcel of Land Contain-
ing sixty five Acres and part of a tract of one Thousand three hundred
