This Indenture made this sixth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven between Edward Scott of Henrico County of the one part and Phillip Hoggatt of the County afores. of the other part witnesseth that the said Edward Scott for and in consideration of one hundred pounds Sterling money of England to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth acknowledge himself satisfied contented and fully payed hath granted bargained sold delivered and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant deliver and confirm unto the said Phillip Hoggatt and to his heirs and assigns for ever one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Henrico whereon the said Phillip now liveth and containing the Quantitie of three hundred ^{and fifty} acres and bounded as followeth to wit beginning at a corner black oak on the East side of Licking hole Creek thence East twenty three Degrees North forty five chains to a corner pine & thence North twenty four Degrees East one hundred and fifty five chains to a corner black oak thence West fifteen Degrees North (crossing Licking hole Creek) eighty chains to a corner pine thence South & seventy four Degrees West one hundred and eighty three chains to a corner pine thence East fifteen Degrees South forty eight chains to the beginning with all appurtinances therunto belonging to have and to hold the sd. three hundred and fifty acres of land and premises with their and every of their appurtinances and every part thereof unto the said Phillip Hoggatt and to his heirs for ever and the said Edward Scott doth by these presents for himself his heirs the said land and premises with their and every of their appurtinances to him the sd. Phillip his heirs & assigns and for ever defend as witness my hand & seal this day above written
