This Indenture made this 17 day of June in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred eighty eight between Henry Clay of y^e one part of y^e County p^r Parish of Henrico and William Pride of the parish of Bristol p^r County of Henrico of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Clay for y^e consideration of the sum of five pounds Currant money to him in hand paid by the said William Pride the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge & himself fully satisfied & hereby doth acquit y^e said William Pride his heirs & Administrators every of them hath granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed & by these presents doth absolutely grant bargain sell release convey and confirm unto the said William Pride his heirs & Assigns two Acres of Land lying & being on the South side of Swift Creek in the County of Henrico Beginning at a Black Oak (crossed) On the So. Side y^e said Creek Near against y^e plantation of Matthew Sigou then running a Short Course from the said Creek four Chains to a cross Black Oak thence up the said Creek holding the full breadth of four Chains from the said Creek twenty Chains to a cross Pohickory thence four Chains to a cross Pohickory standing on the said Creek thence down y^e said Creek as it runneth to y^e place begun at including y^e said two Acres of Land be the same more or less to have and to hold y^e said tract of Land with all its appurtenances & priviledges what soever unto y^e said William Pride his heirs & Assigns for ever to the only use & behoof of the said William Pride his heirs & Assigns for ever & the said Henry Clay for himself his heirs & Administrators doth Covenant & agree with the said William Pride & his heirs & Administrators that they every of them y^e before hereby grants & Land with the appurtenances will warrant & for ever defend against all persons what soever claiming by law or under him or any other person what soever by the said William Pride his heirs & Assigns for ever the said Henry Clay hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his
