unto my son Isaac Dutoit to him and his heirs for ever Item I dole and bequeath unto my daughter
in law Isanne Shobriff one Cow and Calf and a sow Item I dole by this my will and do bequeath
two Cows unto my eldest Daughter Elizabeth Dutoit when she is married and likewise the same unto my
youngest Daughter Mary Ann Dutoit when she be married Item I dole by this my will and Testament
that all the negroes and Movable Estate belonging to me to be divided in portion unto my above named
Children Elizabeth Dutoit Mary Ann Dutoit and Isaac Dutoit after the death of my well
beloved wife Item I do hereby make my dear and well beloved wife to be Executrix of this my last will
testating that this is my last will and Testament which I will have executed after my death and to be
honestly Executed after my death Denouncing all Laws and Maxims which should come to the con-
trary of this my will in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal in presence of witnesses
