In the Name of God Amen Whereas I Peter Dutoit of Mordon in Suisse a Dweller of King William Parish
in the County of Henrico being sick of body but by the grace of God in my right senses and memory knowing
that the hour of Death is uncertain and that it is prudence in a man to declare his last will and Testament to
be Executed after his Decease. I thought it was prudence of me to make my will & Testament in manner
and form as followeth. first I resign my soul to God who gave it to me in hopes of pardon and remission
of sins by the merits and passion of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to be buried according to
the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named I thus my will and Testament that my dear
and well beloved wife Barbara Dutoit shall have During her Natural life the possession of the plantation
whereon I now dwell with all the appurtenances thereto belonging and situate on the South side of James
River containing as by Estimation Sixty one acres lying between John Jovany & Stephen Chaffain
with four hundred acres of land lying and situate on the great branch of the Manokin uper Creek
and other four hundred acres lying on the same branch Joining to the above named four hundred
acres with all the appurtenances belonging thereto I bequeath to her by this my present will all the
negroes with all the moveable Estate that shall be found after my Decease to me belonging for and to
her heirs for ever to Enjoy hold & possess as off their own proper Estate without being troubled by any person
whatsoever to have it praised and to have all my Just Debts and charges paid with those of my funeral

I am I Declare by this my will that I do bequeath unto my eldest Daughter Elizabeth Dutoit the above named
 plantation wheresoever I now dwell after the Decease of my Dear and well beloved wife & her heirs of her
 body for ever but if the said Elizabeth my Daughter have no issue after the Decease of her & her husband
 if she have none, the said plantation to return to the heirs of her. I am I Declare by this my will that I do
 bequeath unto my youngest Daughter Mary Ann Dutoit the hundred acres of Land lying & situate
 as aforesaid to and the heirs of her body without any other formality I am I Declare and do bequeath unto
 my nephew Anthony Bonnin one hundred acres of Land lying and being in the same tract as the above
 four and the hundred acres above mentioned to and for him and his heirs for ever and to enjoy the same
 after the Decease of my wife the said hundred acres to be taken from the north line going up to the south
 I am I Declare and do bequeath by this my will one plantation lying and being situate on the great branch
 of the Manocking upper Creek containing four hundred acres with all the appurtenances thereto belonging
 unto my son Isaac Dutoit to him and his heirs for ever I am I do Declare and bequeath unto my sister
 in Law Joanne Shobrigh one Cow and Calf and a sow I am I Declare by this my will and do bequeath
 five Cows unto my eldest Daughter Elizabeth Dutoit when she is married and likewise the same unto my
 youngest Daughter Mary Ann Dutoit when she be married; I am I do Declare by this my will and Testament
 that all the negroes and moveable Estate belonging to me to be divided in ^{equal} portion unto my above named
 Children Elizabeth Dutoit Mary Ann Dutoit and Isaac Dutoit after the Decease of my well
 beloved wife; I am I do hereby declare my Dear and well beloved wife to be executrix of this my will
 declaring that this is my last will and Testament which I will have executed after my Death and to be
 punctually executed after my Death Denouncing all Laws and Maxims which should come to the con-
 trary of this my will in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal in presence of witnesses
 In Manokin Town King William parish this 2. day of May Anno Domini: 1726.
