

At a Court held for Henrico County of third day of Feb: 1734
 This Will was presented by Joseph Ward and Henry Branch Trustees Thomas Branch and William Branch
 Witnesses thereto being first sworn deposed that the said Will was signed before they came, but that the Testator showed
 them the same and declared it to be his last Will and Testament. Henry Moody the other witness being first sworn deposed
 that he saw the said Testator sign seal and declare the same to be his last Will and Testament and that he witnessed
 his senses at the same time whereupon it was admitted to record.

In the Name of god amen I Richard Cox Esq: of the parish and County of Henrico being sick and weak body
 in perfect sense an memory I thank himightly god for it I do make this my last Will in manner following In presence
 I give and bequeath to my son John Cox and to his heirs & no assigns forever all my outward Land & Building
 and houses where he now liveth Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Henry Cox all my Land siting
 being on the North side of Cornelius Creek containing four hundred acres to the said Henry Cox an his heirs for
 ever only I give to my living wife Mary Cox one hundred acres of the same land where the house is Item by me
 and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Cox and to her heirs one Bell-mettle Shillet a small Iron pot Item I give
 and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hutchens one pig Cow and all her incaps to her and her heirs forever
 I give and bequeath to my grandson Richardson Cox one hundred land few acres of land where my son Richard Cox now
 liveth bynding upon will. Item to my wife Mary Cox and her heirs forever Item
 I give bequeath to my son Richard Cox one Shilling Sterling Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hutchens
 one Shilling Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hutchens my Book and Spectacles Item I give and bequeath
 to my living wife Mary Cox all my hogs and Sheep and my Mare Cidie and Cattle and all rest of my Estate and
 lastly constituted and appointed my living wife Mary Cox my Will and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testimony
 Dismantling and making void all other Wills heretofore by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and affixed my seal the 12 day of July 1734 I also give to my said wife Mary my Negro man Daniel during her
 life and then to return to my son John Cox
