

This Will was presented by Joseph Ward and Henry Branch Trustees Thomas Branch and William Branch Witnesses thereto being first sworn depose that the said Will was signed before they came but that the Testator showed them the same and declared it to be his last Will and Testament. Henry Moody the other Witness being first sworn depose that he saw the said Testator sign seal and declare the same to be his last Will and Testament and that he was in his senses at the same time whereupon it was admitted to record.

In the name of god amen I Richard Cox of the parish and County of Henrico being sick and weak but in perfect sense an memory I thank almighty god for it I make this my last Will in manner following. I give and bequeath to my Son John Cox and to his heirs one assigns forever all my outward Land & being one hundred and five Acres where he now liveth. Item I give devise and bequeath to my Son Henry Cox all my Land & being one hundred and thirty Acres of Cornelius Creek containing one hundred Acres to the said Henry Cox on his heirs forever. Item I give to my loving Wife Mary Cox one hundred Acres of the same land where the House is. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Cox and to her heirs one Belle-metter Shillee a small Iron pot. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hitchens one pig Cow and all her increase to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Richardson Cox one hundred and five Acres of Land where my Son Richard Cox now liveth by deed upon Will. Termes and Mich^l. Surpin lines to him the said Richardson and his heirs forever. Item I give bequeath to my Son Richard Cox one Shilling Sterling. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth for her one Shilling. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Beth Watter my Book and Spectacles. Item I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Cox all my Hogs and Sheep and my mare Bristle and saddle and all rest of my Estate and last by constitute and appoint my loving Wife Mary Cox my Wife and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament. I annuallie and making void all other Wills heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my seal this 13 day of July 1734. I also give to my said Wife Mary my Negro man Saml during his Life and then to return to my Son John Cox
