 God to bless me in this life I give Davis and Disposse of the same in following manner and form I give my Land to my  
 Brother Henry Sharp and if he should die without issue then I do give it to my sister Elizabeth Frogmoreton  
 Son Robert Frogmoreton I give my horse to my Sister Mary Sharp and all the rest of my Estates I give to my Exec.  
 And of this my last will and Testament I make my brother Henry Sharp my sole Exec. witness my hand and  
 Seal this 1<sup>st</sup> Day of Aprill: 1726.

 gives it hoping through y<sup>e</sup> merits of Jesus Christ to receive pardon & remission for all my sins & my body to  
 be buried at y<sup>e</sup> discretion of my Exec. hereafter named Item I give and bequeath to my Daugh-  
 ter Hannah Chuse one Shilling Sterling Item I give & bequeath to my loving wife Martha Stanly &  
 to her heirs for ever one feather bed & furniture which she brought to me (viz) one blue yarn Soft rug  
 three eight quarter blankets five Sheets a cord & hids: also one Sheer at five years old two at two years old  
 and two tons: also one grey Horse branded with a pair of fire tongues Likewise six breeding Sows eight  
 barrows & three Sheats one Iron pot of about three gallons one Chest and one Coffe four powder Dishes  
 four plates & one Basin cup & Salt cellar of powder one Iron pottle & one Bridon &c Item I also
