Item I give to my son Benjamin Andrews one hundred acres to be paid by my Executrix Item I give to my Daughter Dorothy one shilling Item I give to my Daughter Anne Grainger one shilling Item I give to my Daughter Lucy one shilling Item I give to my Son William Andrews one shilling Item I give and bequeath to my son John the plantation wheresoever he now lives with the goods and chattels belonging to the same to him the said John Andrews his Heirs and Assignes for ever and No Morsby his wife or any estate and Appoint my said Son John Andrews my full whole and sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament the witness of my Hand and Seal the day and year first above written.

In the Name of God Amen I Richard Wilson of Henrico County and for no parish being very sick and weak but in perfect sense and memory thanks be to almighty God so much and ordain this my last Will and Testament Item I give and bequeath unto my son Richard and Frau^r Wilson all the land etc^r I now live to be equally divided between them and for them and their Heirs and Assignes for ever Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mathias one bed and furniture belonging to it Item I give and bequeath to my Son George One bed and furniture Item I give unto my Son William One bed and furniture and for all the rest of my debts I desire may be sold and my just debts paid out of it and out of the remainder I order my Daughter Sarah to have four pounds to be paid by my Brother George and the rest if there be any left I desire may be equally divided betwixt all my children by her I too make my Living Brother George Wilson my sole Exec^r of this my last Will and Testament this being my last intent and meaning revoking all other Wills whatsoever In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14 day of March 1731/2.
