 hundred and thirty and six Between John Burton of Henrico County of the one part and Thomas Burton of
 other part Witnesseth that for the Natural Good and Affection which I bear unto my son Thomas Burton I give unto my
 said son and his heirs forever one Tract of Land containing by Estimation eighty five Acres More or less as I have
 said it of Joining on James Burton on the South side of falling creek, which said Land I give unto Thomas Burton and
 his heirs forever together with all Houses, Orchards, woods, underwoods, Water, and Water courses thereunto belonging on
 any ways appertaining together with all the Appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the above named Thomas
 Burton and to his heirs forever hereinafter I do Warrant and forever defend the said Tract of Land as it is laid of
 against me my heirs Executors, Administrators or assigns in Whomever whosoever I have hereto affixed my hand and
 Seal this sixth Day of March 1736.
