I Robert Bevell, of Henrico County in the Colony of Virginia being sick and weak in Body but of sound & perfect mind, and Memory Do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following first I bequeath my soul to Almighty God who made it hoping through the Merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to receive pardon of my sins and my Body to the Earth to be Decently Intred by my Executor hereafter named as to my worldly Estate I bequeath as followeth viz I give unto my Brother W^m Bevell Two hundred Acres of Land being on the East side of Wentura Make, or since George County, I give unto my Brother John Bevell Two hundred Acres lying upon that Land provided he pay out my Wife Eight Shillings & Nine pence Current Money I give & bequeath Parish one hundred Acres of Land lying upon my first land and if my Children provide he live with my Wife until he turne to the Age of Twenty one years and Six months Acres of Land I give and bequeath unto my Wife and four Sons W^m Robert Edward and Joseph Bevell to them and their Heirs forever my Wives part to be in full of her Dower & my Will is that if either of my Sons shall I part this life before arrive to the Age of Twenty one years his part to be given to the Survivor or Survivors of them and all the rest of my Estate of what Nature or kind never I give to be Equally Divided between my Wife and all my Children and lastly I do make and appoint my Loving Wife to be Executor of this my last Will and Testament and Guardian of the Bodies and Estates of all my Children In Minors, whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty Sixth Day of March in the year of our Lord 4d one Thousand seven hundred Thirty and Three

viz he now lieth from thence to Gilbert Adams
and the said Branch joining upon the said
Ferguson aforesaid including the said Land
with the privileges and appurtenances
hereto and appurtenances hereto and the said Samuel
Hancock doth hereby certify that the said Robert
Ferguson the said Land and premises
doth hereafter shall or may be sold to the
Hancock or his heirs or any other whatsoever To purchase
