Said James Cole hath himself for and During y<sup>e</sup> full terms and times of Ninety nine year from this present Date to have hold and securably possess and enjoy y<sup>e</sup> fifty acres of Land with all y<sup>e</sup> premises herein granted unto y<sup>e</sup>. Said Joseph Cole and to his Heirs from y<sup>e</sup> S<sup>r</sup>. James Cole and the S<sup>r</sup>. James Cole both further agree with his Brother Joseph Cole that he shall from time to time and at all times hereafter for and During y<sup>e</sup> full terms and times of the Ninety Nine years herein granted quietly enjoy y<sup>e</sup>. same from me my heirs Executors Assignees and against the claim of all other persons whatsoever that shall or may any wise disturb or molest y<sup>e</sup>. said Joseph Cole During the Ninety Nine years herein granted. And in consideration of the above granted y<sup>e</sup> S<sup>r</sup>. Joseph Cole doth oblig himself his heirs Executors &c keeps y<sup>e</sup> plantation and houses offices and orchards in good & convenientable repair During y<sup>e</sup> full time of y<sup>e</sup> Ninety Nine year and to pay y<sup>e</sup> yearly rent of one Shilling Starling yearly to be paid upon the first day of January commonly called New years Day: and to the true performance of all the premises herein Expressly we bind our selves and our Heirs Earth to other in the sum of fifty pound Starling money of England to be paid to Earth other by him that shall make y<sup>e</sup> first breach of covenant and in witness we both set our hands and seals this 31 day of August 1724.

In the Name of God Amen I Roger Carroll ofourito County being at this present writing in perfect sense and memory blessed be almighty God for it and knowing the uncertainty of this Mortal life do make this my last will and Testament as followeth first I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth one featherbed and furnished to it and my working horse and the choice of two horses & two cows 2. ly & I give and bequeath to Eldest son William the upper two hundred of land lying on the North side of the North River at a place called buck land and only my son William to give to my son Edward whom he shall come to age

Twenty five shillings to Holphum to build a house to him and his heirs forever 3<sup>rd</sup>. I give and bequeath to my second son John the next two hundred acres of land aforesaid to him and his heirs forever only — my son John to have to my son Roger when he shall come to age Twenty five shillings to Holphum to build a house 4<sup>th</sup>. I give and bequeath to my third son Roger the next two hundred of land aforesaid to him and his heirs forever 5<sup>th</sup>. I give and bequeath to my fourth son Stewart the lower two hundred aforesaid to him and his heirs forever 6<sup>th</sup>. my will is that after my just debts and funeral charges are paid the rest of my personal estate to be equally divided between my wife Elizabeth and my living children Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth & my son Thomas Carter and my son William Executors of this my last will and Testament and them to buy a feather bed and furniture fit out of this room in the house if in case any of my fore mentioned sons should happen to die without issue then his part of land to be equally divided amongst his living brothers.

This indenture made this first day of April in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and twenty eight between George Wilson of the County of Henrico and parish of Bristol of the one part and Stephen Hill of the same parish and County of the other part witnesseth that the said George Wilson for and in consideration of the sum of six pounds ten shillings currunt money to him in hand paid by the said Stephen Hill the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge & thereto doth subscribe his name. Stephen Hill his heirs hath bargained and sold and doth by these presents absolutely bargain and sell unto the said Stephen Hill one tract or part of Land containing by estimation — fifty acres more or less lying and being in the County of Henrico and parish of Bristol botwixen a small branch on the North side the said Stephen Hills plantation and a meadow branch on Thomas Wilsons line & being part of a tract of three hundred acres given to the said George Wilson by Last will and Testament of his father John Wilson To have and to hold the said fifty acres of Land with all its privilege & appurtenances thereto belonging or any way appertaining unto the said Stephen Hill his heirs and assigns for ever to the only use & behoof of him the said Stephen Hill his heirs & assigns for ever in witness whereof the said George Wilson hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal the day & year above written.
