I Know all men by these presents that I John Pleasant am holder and firmly bound unto Joseph Pleasant or his sum of three hundred pounds Current Money of Virginia to the Payment of which unto the said Joseph Pleasant his executors & administrators well and truly to be made I bind my self my Heirs Executors and Administrators firmly by these presents Sealed with my seal and dated this 5th day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred twenty eight.

Whereas the above bound John Pleasant hath purchased of Joseph Pleasant as aforesaid the one half part of a Grist Water mill and appurtenances standing on Four mile Creek in Henrico County And whereas for securing unto the said John Pleasant the quiet and peaceable possession of the said one half part of the mill and appurtenances aforesaid against the claim right or title of the said Joseph Pleasant or his Heirs or any other person claiming or hereafter to claim from or under him or any of them the said Joseph Pleasant hath sold and conveyed unto the said John Pleasant three Negro slaves to wit Will, Ned, & Tom the condition of the above obligation is such that if the abovesaid Joseph Pleasant & his Heirs and every other person claiming or hereafter to claim by, from or under him or any of them shall do from time to time and at all times for ever hereafter suffer and permit the above bound John Pleasant and his heirs & assigns quietly and peaceably to have hold occupy possess and enjoy the one half part of the mill and its appurtenances aforesaid without the let molestation disturbance eviction or ejectment of him the said Joseph or any of them if then the said John Pleasant his Heirs & assigns shall suffer and permit the said Joseph Pleasant his heirs and assigns to use occupy and to his and their own profit commit the Labour of the negroes aforesaid and of all their future increase without any other consideration than the sum of £100 per annum to be paid to the abovesaid John Pleasant also in
