Know all men by these presents that I John Pleasants am holden and firmly bound unto Joseph Pleasants in the sum of three hundred pounds Currant Money of Virginia to the Payment of which unto the said Joseph Pleasants his Executors, Adm^r and Assigns well and truly to be made I bind my self my Heirs Executors and Administrators firmly by these presents Sealed with my seal and dated this 31st day of September in the year of our Lords One thousand seven hundred twenty eight.

Whereas the above bound John Pleasants hath purchased of Joseph Pleasants above mentioned the one half part of a Grist
Water mill and appurtenances standing on Four mill Creek in Henrico County And whereas for securing unto the said John
Pleasants the quiet and peaceable possession of the said one half part of the mill and appurtenances abovesaid against the
claim right or title of the said Joseph Pleasants or his Heirs or any other person claiming or hereafter to claim by from
or under him or any of them the said Joseph Pleasants hath sold and conveyed unto the said John Pleasants three Negro
Slaves to wit Mill, Will, and Ned. Now the condition of the above Obligation is such that if the abovesaid Joseph Pleasants &
his Heirs and every other person claiming or hereafter to claim by from or under him them or any of them shall do from
time to time and at all times for ever hereafter suffer and permit the above bound John Pleasants and his heirs & assigns
quietly and peaceably have hold occupy possess and enjoy the one half part of the mill and its appurtenances abovesaid without
the let molestation disturbance eviction or spectment of him the said Joseph or any of them if then the said John Pleasants
his Heirs & assigns shall suffer and permit the said Joseph Pleasants his heirs and assigns to use occupy and to his and
their own profit convert the Labour of the negroes abovesaid and of all their future increase without any other consideration
