 as to my personal Estate I Leave in manner & form following. Item. I give and bequeath unto my
 Beloved wife Dorothy Cuff all my Negroes Abraham Isaac & Juny Aggy & likewise the plantation
 wherupon I now live with all the appurtenances therunto belonging with all the Stock both Cattle
 Sheep and Hogs horses and Mares. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Cuff
 my plantation wherupon I now live after my wifes Decease. Item I give unto my son Edward
 Cuff one Shilling Sterling Item I give unto my son Thomas Cuff one shilling Sterling Item.
 I give unto Mary Alsops my Daughter one shilling Sterling. All the rest of my goods and Cattle I
 Leave unto my well beloved wife Dorothy Cuff of what sort or degree whatsoever making her my
 Sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament dated this 11th Aug^r 1726
