In the Name of God Amen Thomas Laff of Hunterdon County being indward & perfect willed and minded do make and ordain in this my last will & Testament in manner and form following hys I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping for the merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour to obtain the pardon and forgiveness of my sins & my body I command to y^r duff from whence it came and as to my personal estate I mean in manner & form following Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Dorothy Laff all my Negroes Abraham Isaac Jenny Agy & like wife the plantation whereon I now live with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging with all the Stock both Cattle Sheep and Hogs horses and Mares Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Laff my plantation whereon I now live after my wife Dorothy. Item I give unto my son Edward Laff one shilling Sterling Item I give unto my son Thomas Laff one shilling Sterling Item I give unto Mary Alsops my daughter one shilling Sterling All the rest of my goods and Cattels I leave unto my well beloved wife Dorothy Laff of what sort or degree whatsoever making her my sole Executrix of this my Laff will and Testament dated this 11th Augt 1726
