

In the Name of God Amen the 21st day April 1731 I Thomas Andrews Sen^r of Bristol parish in Henrico County being weak of body but of sound mind and perfect memory Thanks be given to God do make and Ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following Inprimis I bequeath my soul into the hands of God who gave it and my body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Excutrix. Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Andrews one one Hundred Acres of Land more or less where he now Liveth beginning at a corner pine from thence to a black oak round bole the 1st to him the said Thomas his Heirs and Assignes for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Andrews one Hundred Acres of Land more or less where he now Liveth beginning at a corner oak that was formerly William Gerrat's and from thence to a corner black oak round bole to him the said Richard his Heirs and Assignes for ever. Item I give to my son Benjamin Andrews one one hundred to be paid by my Excutrix from thence to my Daughter Dornant one Shilling. Item I give to my Daughter Anne Grauger one Shilling. Item I give to my Daughter Anne one Shilling. Item I give to my son William Andrews one one hundred from thence and bequeath to my son John the Plantation where now lives with the good lady Charles beginning to the same to him the said John Andrews his Heirs and Assignes forever and the Heirs by this given Ordain Legitimate and Appoint my said son John Andrews my full whole and sole Excutrix of this my last will and Testament in whereof I have Hereunto set my hand & Seal this day and Year first above Written.

Willson all the Land whereon I now live to be equally divided between them and for them and there Heirs and Assignes for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Wathers one bed and furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my son George one bed and furniture. Item I give unto my son William one bed and forster and for all the rest of my Estate I desire may be sold and my debts paid out of it and out of the Remainder I Order my Daughter Sarah to have four pounds to be paid by my Brother George and the rest if there be any left I desire may be equally divided betwixt all my Children & they do make my Loving Brother George Willson my sole Ex^r of this my last Will and Testament this being my last intent and meaning revoking all other Wills whatsoever In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 14 day of March 1731/2.
