

In the County of Hertford the 21st day April 1731 I Thomas Andrews Senr of Bristol fish
in Hertford County being weak of body but of sound mind and perfect memory thanks be given to God for make and
ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following In witness whereof I Bequeath my soul into the hands
of God who has it and my body to be decently buried at the direction of my Testatrix Item I give and bequeath
to my son Thomas Andrews one hundred Acres of land more or less where he now liveth beginning at
A corner stone from thence to a black oak bounded by his bed to him the said Thomas his heirs and assigns for
ever Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Andrews one hundred Acres of land more or less where he
now liveth beginning at a corner oak that was formerly William Gorrells this from thence to another black oak bounded
to him the said Richard his heirs and assigns for ever Item I give to my son Benjamin Andrews one hundred acres
to be paid by my Testatrix Item I give to my daughter Dorothy one shilling Item I give to my daughter Anne
Grainger one shilling Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth one shilling Item I give to my son William Andrews one shilling
Item I give and bequeath to my son John the plantation wheresoever he now liveth with the good fayre Cutlers belonging
to the same to him the said John Andrews his heirs and assigns forever and No. Horsby this 21st April 1731 I make and
appoint my said Son John Andrews my full whole and sole Testatrix of this my last will and Testament in
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

bequeath unto my son Richard and Anna Wilson all the Land wheresoever I now live to be equally divided between them
and for them and their heirs and assigns for ever Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Matthes one bed and
furniture belonging to it Item I give and bequeath to my son George one bed and furniture Item I give unto my son William one
bed and furniture and as for all the rest of my debts I desire may be sold and my just debts paid out of it and out of the remainder
I order my Daughter Sarah to have four pounds to be paid by my Brother George and the rest if there be any left I desire may be
equally divided betwixt all my children by me made my living Brother George Wilson my sole Execr. of this my last Will
and Testament this being my true intent and meaning revoking all other Wills whatsoever I have henevno
set my hand and seal this 14 day of March 1731/2.
