

I give all my Sheep skins and Guns & Hides of Joseph Witherson, Two Feather Beds, Kynge & Blankets, One Set of Curtains and Valains, a Draper's Litter cloth, an Iron
Saphire Two Iron Pots & Hooks One large, One small, a Brass Kettle I had of Thomas Edwards the Coach standing in the Hall and the Two Tables standing there
Six Leather Chairs Half my Stock of Cattle Sheep and Hogs. On Condition my Son Peter Live to be Twenty One years old, but if he die before he arrive to that
Age then I give the said Two Negroes and all the Things aforementioned to be equally divided between my Two Daughters Mary and Martha and their
Heirs for ever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Mary a Hyoth Leather Trunk marked M. I. and Six Silver Spoons Six Leather Chairs.

Item I give unto my Daughter Martha a Hyoth Leather Trunk and Six Silver Spoons and her Mother wearing cloaths King Silver Rodkin and a Thimble Six
Leather Chairs.

Item I will and direct that my One half Part of Gilbert Mill the Land I lately bought of George Carter the Land mortgaged by Gridle and all the remaining
Part of my Estate except my Two Negroes Junny & Nanny be sold by Maj^r W^m Kenner & Henry M. D. and that Ten Pounds of the Money after my just
Debts are first paid and discharged be given unto my Daughter Judith Farrar and the remaining Part be equally divided between my Two Daughters
Mary and Martha. Item I give unto my Daughter Judith Farrar my black Walnut safe & Eldon Tumbler and Three dozen Spoons.

Item I give unto my Daughter Martha and to her Heirs for ever my Negro Girl Nanny. I also will that the Salary of my Negro Woman Junny shall
be towards the maintaining my said Daughter and that when my said Daughter shall be sixteen years old I will and decree my said Negro Junny
and her increase to be equally divided between my Daughters Mary and Martha and their Heirs for ever.

Item I decree my Sister Martha Wynn to take care of my Daughter Martha and I decree Capt. Henry K. Dolphin to take care of my Daughter Mary.
Item my Will is that if my Daughter Mary or Martha die before they are of Age or married that then the several Legacies hereby bequeathed be as
remain to the Executors of them and if both die then that every Thing given them in this Will be equally divided between my Son Peter & my Daughter
Judith Farrar and their Heirs.

Item my Will is that if my Son Peter or his Heirs shall recover the Money I received for those Negroes that were barged that the same be equally paid out
of what I have here given my Son Peter and Two Daughters Mary and Martha.

Item I constitute & appoint my Son Peter Executor of this my last Will & Testaments my hand and Seal the 15th Day of March 1725.

I Thomas Morton of the County of Henrico being very sick and weak in Body But of perfect Mind and Memory thanks be given unto God therefore
will in mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die and to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
that is to say firstly and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the Hands of God that give it and for my Body I recommend it to be buried
to be buried in a Christian like Manner at the Discretion of my Executor nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same
by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life I give devise and dispose of the same
in the following Manner and Form.

Imprimis I give unto my eldest Son Richard Morton two Hundred and twenty Acres of Land of the Plantation which he now dwells upon Item I give
unto my Son Thomas two Hundred and Fifty Acres of Land lying upon the North side of Appamattuck River in Prince George County Item I give unto
my Son John two Hundred Acres of Land lying to Thomas Morton's Land & William's Land Item I give unto my eldest Son John

Fifty Acres of Land joining upon her Brother John from I give unto my Daughter Judith One Hundred and Fifty Acres of Land joining upon her Sister Anne from I give unto my Son Richard two Cows & Cotes and a young Mare at 12 years of age from I give unto my Son Thomas two Cows and Cotes and a young Mare from I give unto my Sister Ann two Cows and Cotes from I give unto my Sister Judith two Cows and Cotes from I give to my dearly and well beloved Wife Elizabeth whom I likewise constitute make and Ordain my only and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament all the Remainder Part of my Goods both moveables and Immoveables by her to be freely disposed and improved keeping her and conforming this to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the Day and Year above written Signed Sealed and published and declared by the said Thomas Morton as his last Will and Testament In Presence of us the Subscribers

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Harding of Henrico County being very sick and weak of Body but in perfect & sound Memory praise be to God & knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament in Manner & Form following Principally & first of all I Bequeath myself into the Hand of God who gave it & my Body to the Earth to be buried after a decent & Christian like Manner at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, nothing doubting to be saved thro' the Merits of my Saviour & as for such worldly Goods which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in this Life I dispose of it in Manner & Form following.

Item I give & Bequeath unto my well beloved Son William Harding all my Land in Henrico that lies below the Branch called Hardings Branch by Computation One Hundred and Forty Acres be it more or less the aforesaid Land to my Son William & his Heirs for ever the said Land binding on Little Backhoe Creek.

Item I give & Bequeath unto my well beloved Son Thomas Harding my Plantation whereon I now dwell with all my Land that is between Hardings Branch & Drinking Hole Branch with all my Land in Gorchland County that lies between Holland Line & the main Road all the said Land to my Son Thomas & his Heirs for ever.

Item I give & Bequeath unto my well beloved Daughter Mary Thomas all the Land that I have binding on Drinking Hole on the upper side & binding on the main Road on the upper side of the Creek by Computation Sixty Acres be it more or less the said Land to my Daughter Mary & her Heirs for ever, as also I Bequeath to my Daughter Mary One Heifer big with Calf with all that Part of my Estate which she has in Possession at this Time the said Portion to be her Part of my Estate.

Item I do constitute and Ordain my loving Wife Mary Harding whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament Declaring this & none other to be my last Will & Testament revoking all other that may have been by me formerly made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this Fourth Day of March Annoque Domini 1728.
