I give unto my son Stephen Dodson One Mulatto Boy Named Mitt
to him and his Heirs forever. Also I give unto my Daughter Ann
Shackleton one Shilling, Also I give unto my Grand son Edward
Dodson Son of Stephen Dodson a Mulatto girl Named Patt to him
and his Heirs forever, Also I desire that my Estate may not be Appearied
Lastly I Constitute & Appoint my son William Dodson my whole &
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal the day & year
above written.
