 which was Admitted to Records.

 of sound mind and Perfect Memory Thanks be given unto God
 therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of my body & knowing
 it is appointed for all men Once to dye do make & ordain this my
 last will and Testament that is to say Principally & first of all
 I give and recommerd my soul into the hands of God that gave
 it & for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a
 Christian like and decent manner at the Discretion of my Exe-
 cutors Nothing Doubting but at the Generall Resurrection I shall
 receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as
 touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath Pleased God to
 bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the
 following manner & form Imprimis it is my will and
 I do order that in the first place all my just Debts & funeral
 Charges be paid and Satisfied Item I give unto my son
 Thomas the land I live upon, likewise the land I hold I give to him
 & to his heirs for Ever Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Thomas
 two Negroes Tom & Nanne, & her increase I give to him & his Heirs for
 Ever. I likewise give unto my Son Thomas a Brass Kettle
 two Iron pots a Shillett, two Basons, two Dishes, two Guns, a large Chest
 an Oval Table, one feather Bed. Item, I give unto my Daughter Sarah
 the Bed I now lie upon. Item I give unto my Daughter Martha one
 Negro girl called Betty, one feather Bed. two Iron pots two Dishes
 two Plates one Trunk, one Saddle, one Cow & Calf. Item, I give and bequeath
 unto my Son Thomas all the remainder of my personall Estate which

remains more than is already given or mentioned. Lastly I appoint
constitute, make and ordain John Powell my only & sole Ex^r of this my
last Will & Testament and further that my Estate be not appraised
by order of Court, and ¹⁷⁴¹hereby utterly disallow & revoke Dissent all
and every other former Testaments Wills and Ex^r by me in any ways
before this Time named, willed and bequeathed, Ratifying & confirming
this & no other to be my last Will & Testament, In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal the 12th Day of December 1741

afforesaid of the other Part Witnesseth that the said Daniel
Brown for & in consideration of fifteen Pounds Current —
money of Virginia have given to the said George Brown one
Part or parcel of Land lying in the County of Henrico affore-
said & confirmed unto the said George Brown & to his heirs
forever one parcel of Land containing two hundred Acs
lying in Henrico County afforesaid which was by Patent
granted to Daniel Brown Bounded as followeth four hun-
dred hundred Acres of Land in the County of Henrico

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
