This Indenture made the Twenty sixth Day of September in the Year of Our Lord Christ MDCCXXX between Henry Anderson of the County of Henrico —  
 Gentleman of the One Part and William Randolph of the same County Esq<sup>r</sup> of the other Part witnesseth that the said Henry Anderson for and in Consideration of the sum of One Hundred Thirty Three Pounds Eight Shillings and Four Pence half Penny lawful Money of Great Britain to him in Hand paid by the said William Randolph at and before the executing and Delivery of these Presents (The receipt whereof the said Henry Anderson doth hereby acknowledge) hath granted bargained sold, and by these Presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Will<sup>r</sup> Randolph his Heirs and Assigns, all that Mesnage Tract of Land and Plantation where the said Henry Anderson now dwelleth situated lying and being in the County aforesaid commonly called and known by the Name of Winstrock containing One Thousand Acres and all Houses Buildings orchards gardens Ways Waters Rights Privileges Profits and Imoluments whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and also the Rents and Revenues Remainder and Remainders thereof and of every Part thereof, and all the Estate Right Title Interest Claim and Demand whatsoever of him the said Henry Anderson of or to the said Premises and of in and to every Part and Part thereof with the Appurtenances, and also all the other Improvements belonging to the said Henry Anderson commonly called and known by the Names following to wit, Austin, Jo, Harry, George, Sarah and Dugie. To have and to hold the said Mesnage Tract of Land and Plantations and Negro Slaves and all and singular the Properties with the Appurtenances unto the said William Randolph his Heirs and Assigns to the only Use and Behoef of the said William Randolph his Heirs and Assigns for ever PROVIDED always and upon this Condition Nevertheless that if the said Henry Anderson his Heirs and Assigns do and shall pay unto Cole Digges of the County of York Esq<sup>r</sup> and Thomas Nelson of York Town Gent<sup>r</sup> the sum of One Hundred Forty Three Pounds Eight Shillings and Four Pence half Penny lawful Money of Great Britain for which the said William Randolph is become bound to them as security with the said Henry Anderson by Bond bearing even Date with these Presents, and shall indemnify the said William Randolph from all Costs and Damages that may accrue by Means of his being bound as aforesaid Then & from thenceforth these Presents and every Thing herein contained
