to be the true intent and meaning of this party to these presents that in case the said William &
Randolph shall have part of the said tract of Land and not the whole then the said William &
Randolph shall pay only such part of the said sum of one hundred pounds as shall be propo-
rtional to the land which shall happen to be left for want of having In witness whereof the parties

In the name of God almighty William Finney of the University of Glasgow Master of Arts
and Minister of Hanover parish considering the uncertainty of this life do make this my last
will and Testament first I bequeath my soul to the mercy of God through Jesus Christ with my
body to be decently buried in hope of the joyful resurrection of the same at the great day of the
General Judgment Then I give and devise unto my son William and to his heirs forever my
plantation called the woldsend and the Easternmost half of my plantation in St. James's
parish; as also the following Negroes Bill, Amey, to have and to hold the said land and Negroes
to him my said son William and to his heirs forever. I also give unto my daughter Mary
and to her heirs forever the West half of my plantation in St. James's parish and also

the following Negroes, Robin, Caesar and Judy to have and to hold the said Land and Negroes to her my said Daughter Mary and to her heirs forever and if my said Son William & Daughter Mary shall both of them die before they arrive to the age of twenty one years or before they are married then I give and devise the said Land and Negroes (hereafter devised unto them) unto my loving wife Mary and to her heirs forever from my will and I direct that my debts be paid and discharged out of my personal Estate after which I give and bequeath the remainder thereof to be equally divided Amongst my wife and two children (that is to say) after the same shall be valued by Col. Francis Epes, Major Thomas Randolph, and Henry Wood, that my wife retain the whole and pay to my children their proportionable parts of the value; Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my loving wife Mary my whole and sole Executrix of this my will revoking all other wills & testaments by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of February 1726.

between Thomas Jefferson of the one part & Robt. Early of the other part witnesseth that the said Thomas Jefferson in consideration of five shillings to him in hand paid of recd. whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and
hury. S. Robt. Early doth hereby discharge hath granted bargained sold entreated & confirmed
by these presents doth grant Bargain, sell, entreat, & confirm unto the said Robert Early his heirs
and assigns for ever one tract of Land in y^e County afores. containing one hundred acres by 800
mrod or so as is bounded as other of y^e lands of the said Jefferson on the lands of Willm. Early on the
Creek to have and to hold of the said one hundred acres of land more or less to him the said Robt.
Early his heirs & assigns for ever together with all houses woods waters & other appurtenances
thereunto belonging or anywise appertaining in whatsoever place it is. Said Jefferson hath held
unto the said his hand & seal this day & year above written.
