 that the said William Pride & James Hill for and in Consideration of the
 Sum of one Hundred Pounds Curr^t money of Virginia to them in hand
 paid by the said Edward Hill the Rec^t whereof they do hereby Acknow-
 ledge & thereof doth Acquit & Discharge the said Edward Hill his heirs
 Ex^{ts} &c. hath bargained sold alienated, Enfeoffed, & Confirmed & doe by these
 Presents absolutely bargain sell alienate, Enfeoff & Conform unto the said
 Edward Hill his Heires & Assignes forever One Certain Tract or Parcel
 of Land containing by Estimation Two hundred & Forty Seven Acres
 more or less Situate, lying, & being in the Parish of Dale & County of
 Henrico, which said Tract of Land was taken up & Patented by John
 Pride Father to the aforesaid William Pride, & given to him by the Last
 Will & Testament of his said Father that is to say One Moiety or half of
 the said Tract, the other half or Moiety, was given by the said John Pride
 to John Hill Father to the aforesaid James Hill, which sd. Patent was signed by
 Hugh Drysdale Esq^r Governor of Virginia & dated the Seventeenth day
 of August One Thousand Seven Hundred & Twenty five & Bounded as in
 the said Patent is set forth reference thereunto being had with more

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
