This Indenture made this first
Day of September in the Year of our Lord one Thousand
Seven Hundred and forty eight Between John
Nash of the Parish of Raleigh and County of Henrico
of the one Part and John Morricott of the County
of Henrico of the other Part Witnesseth that the
said John Nash for and in Consideration of
the Sum of fifty eight Pounds Current Money
of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said
John Morricott the Receipt whereof the said
John Nash doth hereby Acknowledge, hath
given granted Bargained sold Alien'd Release
and confirmed, and by these Presents doth
give grant Bargain sell Alien Release & Compa-
unts the said John Morricott and to his heirs
and Assigns for ever one Certain Tract or Parcel
of Land Situate lying and being in the Parish
of Henrico and on the South side of James River
Containing two hundred and Ninety six Acres
and bounded as follows to the wit: Beginning at a
Corner Oak standing on the River passing thence
and the said Nash thence on Morricott's Line
South two Degrees West fifty Six Poles to a Corner
Hickory Oak standing on a small Branch
thence South thirty three degrees West three Hun-
dred and fifty four Poles to a Corner Hickory
thence East twelve degrees South one Hundred and
twenty four Poles to a Corner black Oak thence
North thirty three degrees East four Hundred
and Ninety Poles to a Corner black Oak stand-
ing on the River thence up the River ac-
cording to the Meanders One Hundred and
