 property it has pleased God to bless me with do make and ordain this my
 last Will and Testament: — Imprimis — It is my will and desire that all
 my debts be collected by my Executors, and that the just debts I owe be paid
 by them for which purpose I will and desire that my whole estate both real
 and personal be subjected to the payment thereof in the following manner, to wit,
 I desire that as soon as shall be convenient after my decease, my Executors

and he now owns the Mirtilla. I likewise give freedom to Bettie
a mulatto the daughter of the above named Kitty. I likewise give free
to Absalom the son of Mirtilla as above; likewise to a boy called Clay
born after they reach the age of twenty, till then they are to serve my
son Pleasant. Absalom is now about 12 years old, and Clay born at
seven. All the rest is to be free the moment I am dead. I now give to my
good old negro woman called Bess one house in town which is now rented
by two mulattos Judah & her sister at two dollars per month, standing
on the lot where Blacksmith shop is: I likewise give her to be paid in
six months twenty dollars per year, that is, ten dollars every six mon.
But be it always understood the house given to Bess is only for her
natural live, then it is to come back to my son Pleasant. The two
dollars per year to be paid Bess is to be paid by son Pleasant for
which I mortgage every thing hereafter given to her
