mind do hereby constitute this my last Will & Testament
in manner & form as followeth first it is my desire that
all my Just Debts be paid Then I give bequeath unto my
Daughter Betty Morton Gaskright the Tract of Land whereon
I now live also four Negroes Will, Dagg, Betty this Child
Elly, and all the Remaining part of my Estate after my
Just Debt are paid, except one Negro Woman Tenny, to her
this being former provided she live to the age of twenty one
years or has lawful Issue of her body. It is my Will
& desire that if my daughter Betty Morton Gaskright
should die before she comes of the age of twenty one years
or has lawful Issue of her body, that my Land whereon I
now live should remain unto my Nephew Josiah Gaskright
son of my Brother Joseph Gaskright and in that case I

I desire that if my daughter Betsey Weston Garthright
should die before she comes of the age of twenty one years
a lawful issue of her body, that my last intention it
now live should remain unto my Nephew Josiah Garthright
son of my Brother Joseph Garthright and in that case I
give it to the said Josiah Garthright to have this issue -
proven. Also It is my Will and desire that if my daughter
Betsey Weston Garthright should die before she comes of
the age of twenty one years a lawful issue of her body
that all the remaining should be equally divided
between Miles Garthright and my Son
George Garthright and my Son
John Garthright

to them nor all of them & their heirs forever. It is also my
will and desire that my Negro Woman Jenny should be
set free from any further servitude as at Slave this Lady
do hereby appoint Joseph Garthright, Abner Garthright,

William Garthright and Julia Allen Executors to this my
last Will & Testament Witness my hand & seal the seventh
day of January 1785

acknowledges their Bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred
pounds conditioned as the Law directs Certificate was granted
herein for obtaining a probat thereof & a form. Liberty being returned
to the other Executors to join in the Probat when they shall think fit.
