 present posset with not knowing how soon it may
 please God to take me hence I in consideration whereof
 I do hereby Dispose thereof in manner and form
 following.

In presence I give & bequeath to my Son in Law Joseph
 Pucket one feather bed with y^e furniture thereunto
 belonging which he has now in possession of also 3 dishes one
 small Iron pot one small gun and to his wife Judith
 I give & bequeath a her mother's (now deceased) wearing
 clothes and also I give unto y^e said Joseph Pucket one
 black cow and calf and a brown cow named Brannys
 Then I give & bequeath unto my Son Robert one young
 horse named Jockey one black cow named Flora one beautiful
 one black heifer and one feather bed y^e cover with Rug & blanket
 and y^e pair of sheets
 and I bequeath y^e same & a new shirt

one black heifer and one feather bed ^{with Rug & blanket} and a choice of what I have
and a black near gun & a musket

I then I give unto my son Henry one feather bed & bolster
with Rug & blanket & sheets To be the next choice to that of
my son Robert of also a young Cow named Cherry one young
horse named black & a black near gun

I then I give unto my ^{son} John one Cow named Lady one Iron
pot one patche bed Rug blanket & sheet

I then I give unto my son William one Cow named Henry and
a Large Iron pot

I then I give & bequeath unto my son Jacob 40 pound of feathers

I then I give unto my son Stephen 40 pound of feathers

I then I give unto my son Moses being my youngest son
two kepers

and It is my will and desire that all my goods & chattels which
are not already mentioned ^{after my death} be equally divided between my sons
Robert and Henry and that my son in Law Joseph Pickett
shall live and abide on the plantation whereon I now live
and what hog I have my son in Law Joseph Pickett may kill
of them for the use of the family that I leave behind me

for this paper not making waste and what James Carter is
owing ten shillings Cash and Capt Calvil 15 shillings and
ten fifty shillings and all the other debts due to me I desire
~~executors hereafter mentioned~~ they may be put to the
my debts It is also my desire that James Alfred son of
Lester who now lives with me may go to his uncle Charles
Hume to live till he comes of age

And lastly I do hereby constitute ordain and appoint
son Robert & my son Henry and my friend Colonel
William Randolph my Executors of this my Last
will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 22nd Day of January 1742
