and Testament. First I give and bequeath my Soul to God the
Father. Second I bequeath my Body to God to be buried

in such place as my Executors shall think fit and

Thirdly I bequeath and give all what worldly goods it has pleased
God to give me with all respects

Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Daughter Mary Barnes one
pair of Trunks with a small feather bed and Sheet and Rug to

cover my bed and a young man and a young woman and

two young boys and one Negro man named Peter to be paid for
when the same finish

Item I give and bequeath to my Son John Barnes one feather bed
and one pair of Trunks and one pair of shoes and one pair of stockings

Item I give and bequeath to my Son James one feather bed
and one pair of Trunks and one pair of shoes and one pair of stockings

Item I give and bequeath to my Son William one feather bed
and one pair of Trunks and one pair of shoes and one pair of stockings

from James and Elizabeth to my son William Barnes one feather
bed with a rug and blanket and a hat and boots and two
cows and two cows and two Barrels of two year old and
from John two silver Dishes and three Barrels of Corn and one year
Mare and one Bole and Bridle to be paid him when he comes of
age and if J. William Barnes should get to house keeping
before he comes to age then he is to have his things.

Now I give and leave to my son James Barnes the place
called New Providence that I purchased of John William Randolph
to him and his heirs for ever after his mother's death & like
wise give him my plantation at Pickens and if I send unto ye
next branch a good inventory which goes and one good featherbed
and furniture and two cows and ~~Calves~~ Calves and four cows
at that plantation and make sufficient for the first year and six
Barrels of Corn and one Negro girl named Betty and a good
strong young horse and my hole Scurge saddle and Bridle
with one good Iron pot and two silver Dishes and three
and a dozen of spoons.

and bequeave to Loving Dafter Judith R
 of that tract of Land at pickanocks to
 her heirs for ever and an Negro boy named mingo and
 one Negro girl named John and one good offather cow
 one good dog and blanket and a pair of shoes and boots
 and two coats and Calas and some more and two Carrows to
 sell and when I am past for pater Dafter three plates and one
 young mare or horse to be paid for and James Barnes Esq
 the marriage then to be paid at her Marriage other ways to
 be paid by the Estate when these come of age full age
 I do hereby give with that if my Son James Barnes or my
 Dafter Judith Barnes should die in their Minority or with out
 when the others to have it all both their parts and if both
 should die without of the then their Land to be given to
 two sons William and William Barnes and to their heirs
 for ever and ever to stay with my loving wife Daftering it
 and then to be divided

two sons, ~~William~~ and William Barnes and to their heirs
and assigns, to stay with my loving wife during her
natural life and then to be divided between my other children
as if half of my personal estate
I give and bequeath to my loving wife Sarah Barnes after my
worldly debts are paid and these ~~to~~ named one man (char-
les) one woman named Anne and four with all their likes & goods
for ye years during her natural life and at her death to
be divided equally to William and Anne to divide & manage the
said ~~estate~~ my estate hereafter to a great part John
in James City County and the plantation of land from
provided the said Charles will and truly pay the 35 pound sum
my wife ~~and~~ my loving wife holds and lets Executor of this
will and one Testimony as witness my hand this
6th day of June 1720
