and bequeath to my son John Ellis all and every my lands and
Tenements that I shall be possessed of at my death, and likewise I give
to my said son John Ellis one half of the flock of cattle, sheep and Hogs
that we shall be possessed of at my death, all which I give to my son
John and his heirs forever. I then I give the other part of the flock

that we shall be possessed of at my death, all which I give to my
John and his heirs forever. Item I give the other part of the Block
of cattle, sheep and Hogs left after my son John has drawn his half
to be equally divided between Hezekiah Pungar, Susanna Lewis, Elizabeth
Clark and my grandson Robert, son of Joseph Ellis, to them and their
heirs forever. Item I will that all the residue of my Estate (viz.
Woods, Houses, Cash, Household Furniture, Crops, Records & Debts due
me at my decease) be equally divided between my son John Ellis,
Hezekiah Pungar, my daughter Mary, Elizabeth Clark and my
grandson Robert, son of Joseph Ellis, to them and their heirs. Item if
I should purchase any lands between this time & my decease I will that
they be equally divided between my son John, Hezekiah Pungar, Susan
Lewis, Elizabeth Clark and my grandson Robert Ellis. Item I will that my
John Ellis, Thomas Lewis, William Hanley, be Executors to this my
last will and Testament. In Witnes's whereof I have hereunto set my
