I Desire that all my Just Debt may be fully paid, I give to my loving
wife Sarah Hutchings during her natural life the ground whereon
my late dwelling House stands, in the Borough of Norfolk, and at her
Death I give the same with all improvements that may be made in
there to my

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to my wife during her life, all my House wares & Household
furniture and also that part of my other Slaves and my Cattle
and Horses, that her death I desire the same may be equally

Divided among all my Children I also desire that my said wife
may be furnished with fire Wood from my Plantation in Prince
George County, & that she may have One third of my Proportion
of the Stock killed thereon annually. I desire that my said wife

Thomas to my son Joseph Hutchings & his heirs forever, I also give
to my wife during her life, all my House servants & Household
furniture and also part of my other slaves and my Carriage
and Horses; & at her death I desire the same may be equally

Divided among all my Children I also desire that my said wife
may be furnished with fire Wood from my Plantation in Beaufort
County & that she may have one third of my Proportion

of the Neck Hills thereunto. I give also my Head of Land
on Farmer's Creek in the County of Norfolk Several lots in and
adjacent to the Borough of Norfolk which I
bequeath to my said son Joseph & his heirs forever
to be divided in such terms as they shall think meet

my little son the money arising from the sale of the
same to be paid to him by his mother & his father

Now forever and thereby of an undivided part of land in the County of Prince
George known by the name of Hellans also given to my said Joseph the his
 heirs forever all the land lying on the River in the Borough of Norfolk
 which was given to me by my Father & is more particularly described in his
 Last Will & Testament also given unto my said son Joseph Battings the his
 heirs forever my Wharf in the Borough of Norfolk according to my said
 John the privilege of wharfage for the said wharf free from Wharfage
 I give unto my son John Battings & to his heirs forever my lot in the
 Borough of Norfolk which was lately occupied by Alexander Mosley & one
 other lot in the Town of Edmund in the County of Prince George I desire that
 my share of the profits of the Hopewell lately carried on in the Borough of
 Norfolk under the firm of Thomas Foster & Company may be equally
 divided at the expiration of the partnership among all my Children if any
 survives should remain of the money arising from the sale of the Estate -
 I desire that the same should be paid to my said John & I desire that the same

may be equally divided among all my Children — The residue of my
Estate not already devised I desire may be equally divided among all my
Children — I do appoint my Brother John Hutchings & my worthy
Friend Matthew Thrapp Executors of this my Last Will and Testament

hand and Seal this 10th of September 1776
