 equally divided amongst the children of the said Marriage
 and the said Samuel Williamson share alike and to
 them and their heirs forever. Item it is my will and desire that in
 case my said Daughter Mary should survive her said Husband

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and marry again, that then and in that case my said Estate
 be equally divided among the children of both Marriages without
 distinction and that the same be paid in them according to
 the said Division and in their heirs forever. Item it is also
 my desire that if my said Daughter Mary should die without
 Husband or Lady, that then my said Estate be equally divided
 among the aforesaid Samuel Williamson, my Nephew George
 Dabney and my Niece Mary Walker to them & their heirs
 forever.

annexed, but that the same is not signed by the Testator. Whereupon
interrogated deposed that the said Codicil was wrote at the particular
request of the said Testator and read to her in their presence. That she
approved of the same, but was not able to sign it. Whereupon the
said Will and Codicil are ordered to be recorded. And on the motion
of Daniel Williamson one of the Executors named in the said Will who
swore Oath Hereto and together with Alexander Buchanan, John McKean
& Thomas Williamson his Securities entered into and acknowledges their
Oath in the sum of fifteen hundred pounds Association as the
Court is the said Court in Henrico County a Probate thereof

John McKean's Witness hereto. And it appearing to the Court that
the said Witnesses have subscribed themselves as such to the said
inventory, but that the same is not signed by the Testator. The Court
interrogates deposes, that the said Codicil was wrote at the particular
