 Allen, Sarah Allen & Henry Allen to them & their
 heirs. Also I give and bequeath unto my son
 Lottberry Allen the land and plantation whereon
 I now live at the death or marriage of my wife

 Allen & Henry Allen them and their heirs
 forever all the remaining part of my land lying
 in Henrico County to be equally divided between
 them. Also I give and bequeath unto my son
