In the name of God amen, I Mary Crustin
of the County of Henrico being very sick and weak in
body but in perfect mind and memory, do make
and ordain constitute and appoint this my last Will and
Testament, in manner as follows. Item, I give and
bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Hatched one
negro girl by the name of Rachel to her and her heirs
forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son
William Crustin his negro boy by the name of
Cuthbert to him and his heirs forever. Item
I give and bequeath unto my son Archibald Crustin
his negro girl by the name of Marney to him and his
heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my
son Andrew Crustin his negro woman by the name
of Alice and if he should die I give her to my son

Outliving to him and his heirs forever. I then

give and bequeath unto my son Archibald Crutcher
one negro girl by the name of Winney to him and his
heirs forever. I then I give and bequeath unto my

son Aaron Crutcher one negro woman by the name
of Mary, and if he should die before him to my son
Charles Crutcher forever.

One father and furniture to him and his heirs
forever. I am I give and bequeath to my son
Reuben Custer one bay horse to him and his heirs
forever. I am I give and bequeath to my son William
Custer one black horse to him and his heirs forever.
I am I give and bequeath to my son Archibald
Custer one cow and calf and one pewter dish to him
and his heirs forever. My desire is that the residue
of my Estate be sold publicly according to the discretion
of my Executors, and all my lawful debts to be paid
and the remainder of the money to be equally divided
between the Legates above mentioned. I do hereby
appoint my sons Archibald Custer and William
Custer Executors in this my last Will and

Execution to this my Last Will and
Testament, to see the same faithfully performed.
My desire is that my Estate be not appraised
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this twentieth day of December
Anna 1780, One thousand seven hundred & Eighty &c.
