I give and bequeath unto my son William Herbert the

 so, I give the same to my son William Herbert his heirs or
 assigns forever. I give all the following Negroes to my son
 William Herbert in the following manner, Frank, Lucy,
 Ben, Tall, Young, Rose, Pompey, Esther, Ebe, Dany,
 Martin, Ery, Rachel, Abner, &c. &c. I give the
 above Negroes to my son William Herbert and their increase to
 him my son William Herbert his heirs or assigns forever. Likewise
 I give to my son William Herbert all my Stock, household and
 kitchen furniture consisting of Cows, Cattle, Sheep & Hogg. Beds
 and Blankets, &c. &c. I give my son William Herbert to

I give to my son ~~Mr~~ Harbert all my Stock, household and
Kitchen furniture consisting of Cows, Geese, Sheep & Hogg, Beds
and Utensils, likewise I give my son William Harbert to
maintain my beloved Wife Martha Harbert during her natural
life as she has been hitherto and that he should furnish her
with such other necessaries as she shall stand in need of for
her further support and comfort, and if he refuses to comply
with her reasonable demands in the support and maintenance
of herself that then she may demand half of the estate

power of this my last Will and
testament to my son

Witnessed by the Quaker Thomas
Punchback, Thomas Solomon & Sir Blakey three
of the Witness Thistle and Queen to be Records.

And On the motion of William Herbert the Esq.
Thereon moved and made Oak Thistle and together
with Thomas Johnson in John Blakey and John
Dequeshville securities entered into and Acknowledged
that Bond on the penalty of two thousand Pounds
conditioned as the Statute in that behalf made of in and from
their hands and seals.
