Consideration of the sum of twenty two pounds ten shillings per money to him in hand paid by
the said John Bolling the receipt whereof to doth hereby acknowledge and thereof doth recollect
the said John Bolling his self and Anne his wife and every of them hath granted her gauned, sold,
aliened resold, and censured and by those previous debt absolutely grant bargained sell alioe
enslaved and enfranchised and by those previous debt absolutely grant bargained sell alioe
enslaved and enfranchised said John Bolling his heirs and affique and peace to contract --
land lying and being on the South side of James River in the parish and county of Hen-
rice bounded on one side by the land formerly belonging to Henry Land and on the other side
by the land of John Bowman Junr containing by estimation one hundred and fifty acres
be the same more or less which land was by Henry Lee Enveyed to him before his death. and
and by him devised to his Brother Thomas Webb of the City of Gloucester Esq: and by the said
Thomas Webb Enveyed to the said William Randolph and also all tenanted buildings and other
appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging with all the Estate right title Interest claim
property and demand whatsoever of him the said William Randolph and his heirs in and to the
same. **To have and to hold** the said granted land and premises with the appurtenan-
ces and every part there of unto the said John Bolling his heirs and affique for ever to the en-
ly proper use and behoof of him the said John Bolling his heirs and affique for ever in as large and
ample manner to all intents and purposes as to the said William Randolph might or could do
by virtue of the aforesaid conveyance from the aforesaid Thomas Webb **In witness where-**
of the said William Randolph hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year
aforesaid.

In the name of God Amen I Abraham Mickleant being now in the City of Great
in France 1672 now of Virginia in County of Henrico being in a very sick and
weak condition out of bound and perched mind and memory praise be given to Almighty God
to ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth that is
to say first and principally I commend my soule into the hands of Almighty God
hoping through the merits death and passion of my Savour Jesus Christ to have full
and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life and
my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors
hereafter named and as touching the disposition of such temporal Estate as it hath
pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and dispose therof as followeth first I will
that all my debts and funerall charges be paid and discharged Item I give unto my
son Jacob Mickleant two hundred acres of the tract of land I now live on to be held

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of all the upper and thereof to have and to hold to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my Son John Michaux one hundred Acres of the same tract of land joining to this to have and hold to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my Son Abraham Michaux one hundred Acres of the aforesaid tract of land joining next to John to have and to hold to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my loving Wife Susanna the plantation on which I now live with one hundred Acres during her naturall life and then to return to my Son John Paul Michaux to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my three eldest Daughters Anne, Isauemagdaline and Susanna three hundred Acres of the aforesaid land to be laid off at the lower end and equally divided between them to have and to hold to them and their heirs for ever. Item I give to my Daugt. or Olive Indi the remaining part of the aforesaid land to the same more or less to be left on one side or other the aforesaid plantation to have and to hold to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give to my loving Wife Susanna my lands and plantation at Blairden Town containing two hundred thirty three Acres with all appurtenances therunto belonging during her naturall life with privilege to make sale of the same to purchase Slaves the which after her decease is to return to my three young Daughters Elizabeth, Isauemagdaline and Esther mar: to them and their heirs for ever. all the residue of my personal Estate Goods and Chattels wher ever I do give and bequeath to my loving Wife Susanna whome with my Son Jacob I appoint full and sole Executors and Executor of this my last will and Testament and I leave my Executors in full power to sell the abovesaid plantation at Mannakin Town and make undoubted title in, soe as witness my hand and Seal this 12th of May 1717

This Indenture made and concluded this third day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventeen Between Richard Ward Junr of the parish and County of Stearico of the one part and Seth Ward of the same parish and County of the other part witnesseth that the aforesaid Richard Ward for the valuable consideration of fifty pounds per money to him in hand paid the receipt whereof the said Richard doth hereby acknowledge and him the said Seth and his heirs thencefrom and from every part and penny thereof doth hereby discharge and acquit hath given granted sold aliened easement and confirmed and in and by these presents doth give grant alien sell enforfe and confirm unto the said Seth Ward and his heirs for ever all his right title claim and demand unto three hundred Acres of land or if more or less lying and being in the parish and County aforesaid and on the south side of James River being in two parcels viz all the lands sovred unto the said Richard Ward by his Father Richard Ward as by the said a-
