do make and deliver this my last will and testament in manner
and form following that is to say -
I bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty god for everlastingly
of sin and everlastingly life by the merits death and passion of Jesus
Christ my lord and only savior -
I will and desire that all my just debts be fully satisfied and payed
by my executor hereunto mentioned
I give and bequeath to James Martin on negro boy named Peter
and an negro woman named Sarah all the hair of his body
in case that James Martin & Sarah have such then that negro boy and
negro woman I give to my beloved wife to her and her heirs for
ever where I give to James Martin all my geldens and a pair of cattle
and horses where I give to the said James the value of thirty pound
of silver and his old ship and having his wife and child as much as
the things with him as the said James by receipt on him and
the said James which is done in witness that mine my hands tell at

I have given to my beloved wife to her and her heirs for
 ever all that piece of land which I my garden and in part of garden
 and bushes of some of year to the said James the wife of thirty pound
 of silver and silver. And leaving his wife and children as much as
 as she brings with her in the said James by warrant on fees and
 the said James which is above mentioned shall mine my lands tell of
 my wife to pay. John James shall have the negro woman named Jack or
 upon of year and to both to John James or negro man named Jack or
 the negro woman named Jack either of them which the said
 James Martin please and to give to John James some cows and what
 other of my cloth the said James please to give him the negro is
 to have and his heirs for ever
 of year and to both to my next beloved wife and children
 a negro boy named Helen and negro woman named Jane and all the
 best of my much of the said James in material fees but in case the
 said James Martin which is above mentioned hath an heir of his own
 body then to him and his heirs for ever but if none of the said
 Man to my beloved wife and her heirs for ever
 my will and desire is that the said James Martin shall to my wife and
 John executor of this my last will and testament Renouncing all

whereunto I have set my hand and placed my seal the day and year first
above written
