any kind of Timber of the land. I do hereby
John Correll should die without him then my estate
to be equally divided amongst Robt. Winston's Children
I also desire that my Cousin Elizabeth Carter shall be
maintained out of my estate during her life I do hereby
appoint my wife Elizabeth Correll, William Rogers,
Thos. White & John White Executors to this my last
will.

Carter, William Hills & James Bradley the Witnesses
& Ordered to be Recorded And on the motion of William
Rogers one of the Executors therein named who made
Oath thereto and together with John Bins & Philip Bins
two Jurors entered into and acknowledged their Oath
in the presence of the Court & made a Certificate as
the Law directs Certificate was granted him for
obtaining a Probate thereof as an Executor being
resided to the other Executors named in the said
