

(P) I, Rufus Randolph being of sound mind & memory do
make this my last Will and Testament in manner
By Randolph
Will. as follows: I give & devise to my daughter Aggy
these two Children Sylvia Anderson now three years
old, and Alexander Philip now one year old from
the date hereof; I direct that my whole Estate, both
real & personal, except what is hereafter devised to be
sold on my death & the proceeds to my niece, Janet Botting,
my Worcester Ring. I give to my Nephew Richard
Randolph of Coles; the picture of my Father & Mother
& two Silver Waiters with their Arms. I give to my said
Niece & daughter Aggy all my household furniture of
any kind including Gold & Silver excepting what is
first comprehending Tables, Chairs &c. and all my
wearing apparel I give to William Waters over

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...comprehending Tables Chairs &c And all my
wearing Appare I give to William Waters one
hundred pounds as soon as possible after my death
then pounds Sterling during his life He have his
passage paid immediately to Great Britain, I give
my own portrait in Enamel to my Niece Mrs Douglass
It is my Will that my Executors whom I now re-
pose confidence in, shall be

Christened do as soon as possible after paying all my
legal & just Debt raised from the sale of my property
I reserve the sum of one thousand pounds Sterling to be
paid out of my very faithful
...of the Exchequer

to be paid to the said Citty the moment it arrives
after her arrival in England and amount to interest
of the other two thousand pounds to be paid in
one equal part of one half to the Girl till she
comes of age and the same to the Boy till he comes
of age It is my Will and the sole object of it, that
the above sum of three thousand pounds sterling be
paid as aforesaid for the above purposes - I give unto
my Brother's Servant Maids Son William Davis
five hundred pounds I give to William Ryland furter
five hundred pounds I give unto George Woodson
five hundred pounds I give freedom to my Slaves -
Leonora, Will, Arthur, Nelly, Bony, John. This is
my Will signed this seventh day of December 1784.

(18) The Court held for Henrico County at the Court House in
Richmond on Monday the 1st of February 1784.

This Will together with the two Codicils thereto annexed
were produced in Court by Richard Randolph & were being
read out to the same John Chesnut & Richard Shaffer
being sworn severally deposed that they are well acquainted
with the Testator's hand writing & truly believe that the said
Will and Codicils and the names thereto subscribed are all

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of the said Testator's hand writing Whereupon the said Will
& Codicils are ordered to be recorded And it appearing
to the Court that the Executors named in the said Will
have refused the Executorship & also that the Estate of
the said Decedent is likely to be waste & embarrassed

On the motion of the said Richard Randolph who made
oath thereto and together with David Mead Randolph &
John Salmon for his Secretary entered into & acknowledged
their Bond in the penalty of ten thousand pounds

Wills and coming Wills on the said Will
Hodules are Ordered to be Recorded And it appearing
to the Court that the Executor named in the said Will
have refused the Executorship Also that the Estate of
the said Decedent is likely to be wasted & embogged
On the motion of the said Richard Randolph who made
oath thereto and together with David Head Randolph &
Moses Salton for his Securities entered into & acknowledged
their Bonds in the penalty of ten thousand pounds
Conditioned as the said Certificate was granted
him for obtaining Letters of Administration on the said
Decedents Estate with the Will aforesaid annexed
in due form.
